#### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

Family remains healthy...the prayers are working! Unfortunately many nursing homes in our surrounding area have been hit hard with COVID. Our thoughts and prayers are with them during this difficult time and we ask that you join us in praying for both the sick and those who are working the front lines. At this time, all three wings at Maryhill are currently in quarantine again as we are considered in outbreak mode. We continue to monitor all residents 3-times a day and we are conducting testing weekly while in outbreak mode. Staff are screened at the beginning of each shift and we continue to test ALL staff two times a week. In addition, we are implementing some additional safe-guards for staff who have missed our bi-weekly testing prior to returning to work. Staff is required to stay home and quarantine if they have any symptoms or if they have been exposed to someone who is sick or has tested positive. Everything you do to protect yourself and limit the spread of COVID also helps protect your loved one at Maryhill. The less spread we have in the community, the less chance we have of a positive resident. We are all in this together. We ap-

Thank you to everyone who participated. Our Maryhill Family sure has some cute pets! It was a tough competition but Tucker was voted the cutest by our residents!



Fall is upon us or should I say winter. Each fall when the grains and vegetables and fruit have harvested in the northern parts of the world, Christians keep a harvest feast.



On NOVEMBER 1, ALL SAINTS' DAY, we celebrate God's harvest.....the great gathering in of the saints. We don't let the dark or the cold chase us indoors depending on the day. Instead we rally! At Maryhill we will be holding a Communion Services in the hallways, followed ringing the bells at NOON along with all our protestant brothers and sisters in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and some churches in Northern Wisconsin to remember our fallen saints from Covid-19.

On NOVEMBER 2, ALL SOULS' DAY, we will be remembering our saints who have died this past year by putting a Memorial stake in the ground out front with their name on it to remember them and honor their lives. If you happen to drive-by Maryhill, please say a prayer for all the community of saints.
